#### "Bare Feet on Holy Ground"

The bush was burning. It should be reminder of this. a pile of ashes. But it was not burning up. The shepherd was curious so he moved toward the fire-proof bush. "God called to him from the bush. 'Moses! Moses!' 'Here I am!' Moses replied. 'Do not come any closer,' God told him. 'Take off your sandals, for you are standing on holy ground." Exodus 3:3-5 (NLT)

Do you wear shoes in your home? Not in our home. Our entry sometimes looks like a shoe store after a group of teens has tried on every "cute" shoe. If you need a new pair of shoes, come to our house during a party, and as you leave, just choose a better pair that

Why do we take off our shoes at home? Because we always have. It is comfortable and it feels like our floor stays cleaner. Did God tell Moses to take off his sandals because Moses would be more comfortable? To keep the pebbles, snakes and dirt clean? No. Why did Moses have to take off his sandals? Because God told him it was "holy ground".

Holy ground? Because pebbles, snakes and dirt are holy? Was there a hidden holy scorpion? The ground was holy because God was there meeting Moses. It was all about God.

While the Israelites wandered in the wilderness, God told them to build a tabernacle, "I want the people of Israel to build me a sacred residence where I can live among them." Exodus 25:8 (NLT)

The tabernacle was an important structure, a special sanctuary. God gave very specific instructions about its materials and construction, how the services were to be conducted, who could come inside and even the exact equipment and furnishings.

God did not need a house. He did not design His home for Himself. He did not need a place to live. Then why did He want them to build a "sacred residence"?

He wanted His people to know that He was with them. He wanted them to remember that He was part of their life. The tabernacle was an assurance and

The tabernacle was where God provided revealed His will and instructions. Exodus 25:21-22. tabernacle was where the High Priest would confess the sins of God's people and where the sacrifice is offered. The tabernacle was where God told His beloved people that they were forgiven. The tabernacle was a reminder to His people that He wants to walk and talk with them, like He did with Adam and

God did not and does not need a reminder that He loves us or that He wants to "live" with us. He doesn't need a residence on earth. remembers that He loves us and lives with us.

Every Sabbath we come to CJACC. We worship in our sanctuary. Why? Are we here because the concrete, stucco, wood or electronics are holy? No. Do we have to come here to meet each other? No, we can meet for God's leading and caring. anywhere. For great sermons? No, we can get that on the TV, radio or CDs.

On April 23, 2011, we had a special service in the afternoon and dedicated our sanctuary to God. We had posters and a slide show to remember our roots. Southern California Conference officers came with special messages and prayers. We praised God for leading us to this location, to this specific building.

Why did we dedicate our sanctuary? Why was that specific room with the pews and high ceilings dedicated? What is now the purpose of our sanctuary at 2113 East Villa Street in 2013?

Like the tabernacle of the Israelites wilderness wandering, does sanctuary and its services foreshadow the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on Calvary? No, the debt for our sins has already been paid by Jesus' death. Do we need to go to the tabernacle to learn God's will? No, the Holy Spirit impresses our hearts and minds and through His written word.

So do we still need the sanctuary? Yes. Why? Just as the tabernacle was holy, just as the ground around the

burning bush was holy, our sanctuary is holy. How is jour sanctuary of wood, concrete and cloth holy?

Let us first define "holy". According to Holman's Bible Dictionary, "holy" means "to be set apart" by or for God. Buildings, writings, places, objects and even persons may be holy if they are set apart because of God's presence or God's special blessing.

Dedicating our sanctuary was our declaration that the space was set apart for God. Not to give Him a place to live but as a reminder for us. A reminder that God loves us and still cares about our needs.

Whenever we worship God in our sanctuary, it is a time to recall His leading while we searched for a church home. When we walk through our sanctuary, we remember the entreaties we prayed at noon every day. When we raise our voices in praise, our praises reflect our thanks

"The main purpose of our church is to experience the power of the living God." Our sanctuary is a place of reverence, where we are reminded of our connection with God. Let us remember that our sanctuary is holy ground because just as His presence in the burning bush made the desert sand holy, God is present in our sanctuary.
